
Tis the season for holiday parties and cheer and Crime Stoppers would like to remind everyone to stay safe on the roads.


Here's what to do if you suspect a driver is impaired.

- Call 911 if it is safe to do so. Calling 911 in an emergency, or to report an impaired driver, is permitted while driving under the distracted driving law.
- Report the location, vehicle description, and license plate number.
- If possible, keep the vehicle in sight but do not attempt to chase the vehicle, or break the law to do so.

If you know of someone who regularly drives intoxicated, you can report that information to Crime Stoppers anonymously. Remember to provide as much information as possible, including where the person lives, works, vehicle description, licence plate number, if you know specific times of day the person is typically driving impaired.

The more information you can provide will assist police. You can report this information online at p3tips.com or download the app. You can also phone **1-800-222-8477** – all safely and anonymously. Stay safe this holiday season!

HAVE INFO **ABOUT A CRIME?**

Crime Stoppers exists primarily as a means of collecting information from the public – anonymously. Tipsters contact Crime Stoppers by phone, online at p3tips..com or by downloading the app.

When you use any of these methods, you will be given a unique tipster number. This number should be kept secret and recorded, as it is how you will be able to follow up on your tip to either add additional information or check to see if there was a reward.

TALK

Crime Stoppers takes the information given by the tipster and distributes it to the appropriate law enforcement agency (i.e. to the Edmonton Police Service in Edmonton and the RCMP in Northern Alberta).

We do everything we can to protect your anonymity because we know that by disclosing important information about a crime, having your identity revealed might put you at risk. The only time your anonymity may be open to challenge is in the following situations:

- A call to Crime Stoppers made with the intention of "furthering criminal activity or interfering with the administration of justice". A party who is guilty of a crime cannot use Crime Stoppers to try to divert the blame onto someone else. Crime Stoppers cannot be used to try to "frame" an innocent person.
- There is evidence that disclosure of some or all of a tip is necessary to establish someone's innocence.
- A tipster having received the benefit of full legal advice may, for his or her own reasons, elect to waive the privilege.
 A full and more detailed explanation of these principles can be found on the Canadian Crime Stoppers website canadiancrimestoppers.org.

If the tip information helped the police make an arrest, the officer on the file will submit a form to the Crime Stoppers board stating this. The board meets monthly to review the solved cases and determine a reward amount (between \$50 and \$2,000) for the tipster. At this point, a note is made on the file.

HOW DO I CHECK MY TIP?

To check whether your tip has become eligible for a reward, you must call the tipline (1-800-222-8477) and provide your tipster number. The call taker will check to see if a reward has been authorized for that tip.

IF MY TIP RECEIVES A REWARD, HOW DO I PICK IT UP?

Crime Stoppers works with ATB Financial to distribute the tip rewards. If your tip received a reward, you will be able to choose any ATB branch in Alberta to pick up your reward. The branch will prepare an unmarked envelope with cash. You can walk into the branch, simply provide your tipster number, and walk out with the money. Your tipster number is the only information they ask for – another reason why it is important to keep this number secret so that no one else can pick up your reward.





While you may love to share your travel adventures, posting vacation pictures advertises the fact you are away. You might have locked down settings, but your friends might not, and there is a chance criminals might be checking social feeds to see who's away.





If you have ATVs or snowmobiles, ensure they are locked away in a shed or garage. Out of sight, out of mind! One way to deter would be thieves is to make sure it looks like someone is home. Light timers or smart plugs can help with this. Motion sensor outdoor lights also act as a deterrent.



HIDE THE EVIDENCE

If Santa brought you a new flat screen 72" TV, entertainment system or tablet – don't leave the boxes out as is for recycling collection. Thieves often look to see which homes have fancy electronics. Your best bet is to dismantle the boxes into smaller pieces, put them in blue bags or take them to a recycling centre in your community. Leaving them on your property signals to thieves you may have some cool stuff in your house.

As Alberta's provincial police service, the RCMP provides assistance to over 1.5 million Albertans. The RCMP has been policing rural and urban areas in Alberta for generations.

In this interview, Superintendent Peter Tewfik, Officer-in-Charge of Crime Reduction Strategies with the Alberta RCMP, addresses some of the most common questions raised by members of the public about crime reduction.

IS RURAL CRIME
ON THE RISE? ARE
THERE
PARTICULAR
TRENDS
PERTAINING TO
CRIMINAL
ACTIVITY?

Overall, property crime is down in Alberta. Our 2019 third quarter statistics show that there has been a steady decrease in property crime in Alberta RCMP jurisdictions since the high point in 2017.

We've heard people say they've noticed an increase in crime and that they aren't reporting incidents.

According to the 2014 General Social Survey on Canadians' Safety, which provides information on Canadians' crime reporting behaviour, less than one-third (31%) of crimes in Canada are reported to police.



RCMP statistics cannot reflect crimes that were never reported: we rely on reported data to know where we are needed the most.

WHAT CRIME
TYPES DOES THE
RCMP TYPICALLY
DEAL WITH IN
RURAL AREAS?

Given the size of the province and the diversity of communities we serve, this is a challenging question to answer. With regard to property crime, our three biggest drivers in rural areas are break and enters, theft of vehicles and theft.

The Alberta RCMP Data and Innovation web page highlights detachment area-specific key property crime indicators on a quarterly basis, namely break and enter, theft of motor vehicle, theft over and under \$5,000, as well as possession of stolen goods.

WHAT IS THE RCMP DOING TO REDUCE CRIME IN RURAL ALBERTA? HOW EFFECTIVE HAVE YOUR INITIATIVES BEEN?


The Crime Reduction Strategy is making an impact in reducing crime in Alberta by focusing on the people and places dealing with the most prevalent crime types within each community.

The four Crime Reduction Strategy pillars are apprehension, offender management, targeted prevention and suppression. We have made our operations as efficient as they can be and minimized impact to frontline services.

We have multiple campaigns as part of our Crime Reduction Strategy such as #WantedWednesday and Project Lock Up.

#WantedWednesday is a social media campaign which profiles individuals who pose a threat to community safety with active warrants believed to be living in Alberta. These individuals are selected based on an analysis of their criminal history and how much potential harm they present to a community.

The campaign consists of posts on social media platforms every Wednesday afternoon with an update to how many individuals were apprehended at the end of the week.



Another area of focus is Project Lock Up, a crime reduction initiative intended to help reduce repeat victimization from property crime and prevent repeat break and enters to the homes and businesses of Albertans.

Through Project Lock Up, we're identifying the properties that are most vulnerable to crime and providing the owners with the tools and advice for proactively securing their property.

RCMP officers and trained community policing professionals contact citizens that have been hit the hardest by break and enters to discuss the loss and determine what environmental design or local enforcement steps might help prevent repeat victimization.



WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO SHARE INFORMATION ABOUT SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY?

Your calls for service to the RCMP matter. Being led by intelligence, information about where and when crime is happening is key to the Crime Reduction Strategy for the Alberta RCMP. This intelligence weaves the different components of our Crime Reduction Strategy into a shared goal of community safety; from finding the criminals that cause the most harm, finding the victims that need the most support and collaborating with the right partners to keep Albertans safe.

In the past, we've heard that people say they've noticed an increase in crime, but that they aren't reporting the incidents. Do not assume someone else has reported it.

We can always do more with more information. A report to the police is all information we can analyze and use. Times of the day, locations, and types of vehicles observed are all helpful to us.

We share this information with our community groups, such as Crime Stoppers, to help identify crime hot spots, guide patrol activity and conduct special operations in your community.

HOW ELSE CAN CITIZENS HELP THE RCMP IN REDUCING CRIME?

We encourage residents to continue practicing simple crime prevention strategies. The Alberta RCMP Crime Prevention Calendar provides monthly themes that are used throughout the year for educational messaging via social media posts, news releases and media interviews.

Our aim is to ensure citizens have the information they need to prevent crime and stay safe.


In 2017, an average of 34 vehicles were reported stolen per day in the province of Alberta. At least 50% of those vehicles had the keys inside. Always lock your vehicles and remove your valuables. You should also keep your residence doors locked as well as your garages and outbuildings secured.

The Alberta RCMP Crime Map is also a powerful crime prevention tool. The real-time Crime Map tracks and records select crime types for a two-week period.



The purpose of the Crime Map is to alert communities of activities in their area so citizens can be mindful about protecting themselves and their property. It is hosted on several municipalities web pages, but the easiest place to find the map is on the homepage of **crimestoppers.ab.ca**.

Since its inception in February 2018, the Crime Map (pictured below) has been viewed over 2.9 million times.



HOW DOES CRIME STOPPERS HELP THE RCMP IN PREVENTING AND SOLVING CRIMES?

Crime Stoppers and other citizen-led group volunteers support the Alberta RCMP Crime Reduction Strategy by acting as an extra set of "eyes and ears" in their communities.

Crime Stoppers brings together the police, media and the community to reduce crime. Tipsters can anonymously report information about crimes or suspicious behaviour by calling 1-800-222-8477 or submitting information online at p3tips.com.

Since the beginning of 2019, Crime Stoppers of Edmonton and Northern Alberta has received 4,232 tips resulting in 213 arrests, \$105,015 in property recovered and over \$1 million in illicit drugs seized.


The Alberta RCMP continues to work with community partners such as Crime Stoppers to promote crime prevention awareness in communities throughout the province.
